

An invasive tropical mosquito *Aedes aegypti* has been identified in York.

This is the first time the mosquito has been identified in Nebraska.



We still have a chance to get rid of it, IF YOU HELP!

This mosquito grows in water that is sitting in containers or objects, NOT pools or floodwater areas.

- 1. Please LOOK around your property and at the area surrounding your property weekly.
- 2. Please <u>DUMP</u> anything containing standing water (see images on the back).
- 3. Please <u>REMOVE</u> anything unwanted or unneeded that can collect water.
- 4. Please use a "mosquito <u>DUNK</u>" for anything that is collecting water and cannot be removed.
